Mrs. Millet's letter to the Editor of June 25 was an accurate account of the Illinois International Women's Year (IWY) Conference held in Normal, Ill. June 10-12. I, too, found the unethical conduct of the conference appalling.

I also found other things quite disturbing. For instance, although this conference was funded by part of the \$5 million given the IWY by the federal government (I believe the amount for the conference was about \$100,000), not once did I see the American flag displayed.
