


Fact Sheet: Heartbeat Bill

If a heartbeat is detected, the baby is protected.


Heartbeat Bill Defined: A bill at the federal or state level to make abortion illegal once doctors detect an unborn child's heartbeat.

A fetal heartbeat can be detected between 6 and 12 weeks of pregnancy.

If enacted in every state, heartbeat bills would save nearly 1 million children per year.



Heartbeat bills have passed in six states this year. Nine other states introduced the bill during the 2019 legislative session.



Heartbeat bills are designed to be challenged in the Supreme Court. With President Trump's new appointees, there are enough conservative votes on the Court to overturn *Roe v. Wade*.
