

Fact Sheet: Equal Rights Amendment

The U.S. Constitution given to us by our Founding Fathers is gender-neutral. Rather than use the words "man" or "male," the Founding Fathers intentionally used the word "persons."

The Equal Rights Amendment wouldn't "put women in the Constitution." However, it would:

- Make abortion-on-demand at taxpayer expense a constitutional right.
- Force young women to register for the military draft.
- Give men a constitutional right to be in women's restrooms, locker rooms, hospital rooms, and prisons.

- Eliminate sex-specific aid programs like Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).
- Revoke the tax-exempt status of churches that do not ordain women.
- Eliminate government funding of battered women's shelters and similar charities.

The Founding Fathers left the sexes out of the Constitution not because they were sexist, but because they weren't. That makes them a lot smarter than the Congress we presently have — Democrat or Republican.
