ONE IN FIVE addicted gamblers **ATTEMPTS SUICIDE**, which is more than any other addictive disorder, according to the National Council on Problem Gambling.

GAMBLING UNFAIRLY TARGETS MINORITIES.

A survey of more than 43,000 adults showed that blacks, Hispanics, and Native Americans are twice as likely to suffer from gambling disorders. Tying gambling to sports will expose millions of underage fans to a potentially dangerous vice. Even if they don't engage in it as minors, it will certainly be normalized to them.
